## Year 6 SATs Information

### **English reading**

This paper may include questions covering:

- Fiction: Stories; Extracts from novels; Short narratives
- Non-fiction: Information texts; Biographies; Reports; Articles
- Poetry: Poems of different styles and themes

The questions in the reading paper are designed to test different comprehension skills, including:

Retrieval: Finding and copying specific information from the text.

<u>Inference</u>: Making logical guesses based on evidence in the text.

Summarisation: Summarising main ideas or events.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: Understanding and explaining the meaning of words in context.

<u>Comparison</u>: Comparing and contrasting information or ideas within and across texts.

Explanation: Explaining how information or ideas are related and how they contribute to the overall meaning of the text.

The paper includes a mix of question types such as multiple choice, short response, and open-ended questions.

Encouraging your child to read to you, reading to your child and chatting about what has been read are great ways to help your child get SATs reading ready.
